Dress Code



- All students are required to wear the school uniform every day.
- We ask that you support us in ensuring that your child is dressed in the correct clothing at all times.
- If students cannot wear the school uniform on a particular day, then they are required to have a written explanation (in their diary or a note from home).
- Students not wearing school uniform will not have access to the oval at recess and lunch times.

Replacements for lost hats can be purchased from the Front Office.

EXAMPLES OF UNACCEPTABLE CLOTHING

- Non dress code coloured clothing
- Singlets, tank tops or any clothing that bares the shoulders
- Tops or pants printed with offensive or suggestive comments, jeans that are frayed, with hole or large logos
(this is at the discretion of the Principal or nominee)
- Thongs, backless / strappy shoes, high heels (shoe heels should be no higher than 3 cm)
- Body piercing
- Make – up
- Bangles and bracelets are limited to one per child, minimal jewellery at own risk
- Dangling earrings or more than 2 studs per earlobe
- Tight and or very short shorts
- T-shirt's tied up
- If leggings /tights are worn then the t-shirt needs to be long enough to cover the bottom, leggings / tights are not to be see through / transparent
- False nails—safety concern for sports / P.E. lessons
- Hooded jumpers (hoodies) - unless in maroon school colour
- Wheeled / Wheelie shoes as these may cause damage to the Gym floor and pose a safety concern for PE lessons
