

UNIFORM POLICY

Context

The Governing Council has the right to determine a school's Uniform Policy. The purpose of this policy is to develop a sense of school pride and unity amongst the members of the school community.

Dress Code

- Beside the official uniform items, any other clothing must be plain black or navy (no loao)
- Footwear sneakers are preferred however school appropriate sandals are acceptable in Term 1 and 4 and school appropriate boots are acceptable in Terms 2 and 3.
- Taparra Primary School is a sun safe school. All students must wear a hat when outside each day throughout the year.

Uniform Items

- Taparra PS Polo Top
- Plain black shorts or pants
- Taparra PS jumper or plain navy jumper
- Taparra PS bucket hat
- Taparra PS beanie
- School bag
- Watches and any fitness related bands are acceptable unless they have photo or video function

Uniform Exclusions

- Clothing not in school colours as outlined in this policy.
- Baseball caps
- Hoods
- Jeans
- Midriff tops and tank tops
- Ripped or torn clothing
- Miniskirts and brief shorts nothing shorter than mid-thigh
- Jewellery (other than ear studs and or necklace), Make up, nail polish, false nails

Non Compliance with School Uniform Policy

Parents/caregivers will be notified if inappropriate clothing is worn and be requested to provide suitable clothing. Where there is a repeated problem the school may require one of the second hand uniforms to be worn for the day. Students who forget their hat will be asked to play under sheltered areas
