ROOM 13 SHOWCASE













In Room 13, we've been learning all about the Olympics, and it's been an exciting part of our English lessons. Our students started by exploring the history of the Olympics and the values that make a great Olympian, like dedication, perseverance, and sportsmanship.

Each student picked an Olympian to research. They found out about their chosen athlete's Olympic history, training schedule, and how long they've been competing. This research helped the students improve their investigative skills. After that, they wrote letters to their Olympians, asking questions about their lifestyle and training, and sharing a bit about themselves. This activity really boosted their letter writing skills.

Our students also got creative by designing their own Olympic events and making detailed profiles of their Olympians. We learnt about the history of Indigenous Olympians and celebrated their achievements.

This project has helped our students become better researchers, more creative thinkers, and stronger writers. We're so proud of the hard work and enthusiasm they've shown, and we can't wait to see how this inspires them in the future!



















WELLBEING CORNER

Wellbeing and Engagement Collection Survey 2024

In Term 2, the year 4-6 cohort had the opportunity to participate in the Wellbeing and Engagement Collection Survey (WEC). The survey collects information about non-academic factors relevant to learning and participation. The WEC gives schools, the community and government an insight into what needs to occur to ensure students experience success and are provided with resources and opportunities to reach their full potential.

Taparra's WEC results showed outstanding growth and a strong display of emotional wellbeing, engagement and learner readiness. It was highlighted that:

- 1 86% of students reported they have an important adult at school that they can trust. This is 27% higher than the state average.
- 178% of students reported they have high levels of friendship intimacy and social support from peers.
- Thigh levels of emotional engagement had increased by 35% (78% of all students) compared to previous years.
- Thigh levels of cognitive engagement had increased by 22% compared to previous years.

This data truly reflects the engaged, kind and hard working learners at Taparra who are supported by dedicated staff members. We thank all the students for their participation.











APPLYING



All types of School Card applications are now online.

- STEP 5 Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button. Please note: if you exit the form without clicking 'SUBMIT' your details will be lost.

You can save the form, and return to complete it at another time, by clicking on the 'SAVE' button.

SAFETY & REMINDERS




SPEED LIMIT


